Taproot Theatre premieres Katie Forgette's *Evidence of Things Unseen*

SEATTLE, WA – March 27, 2017 – Taproot Theatre Company will present the world premiere of Katie Forgette's new drama, *Evidence of Things Unseen*. The Seattle native's drama will be directed by fellow Seattle native, Scott Nolte – TTC's Co-Founder and Producing Artistic Director. Scott Nolte, TTC's Producing Artistic Director, helms this new work. He most recently directed the world premieres of *Dracula* and *This Christmas*. His other notable work at TTC includes *The Trial of Ebenezer Scrooge*, *Joyful Noise* and *Best of Enemies*.

The all-star cast is led by **Michael Winters** (*Gilmore Girls*) as patriarch Jack, **Christine Marie Brown** (Village Theatre's *Mary Poppins*) as Abigail, **Jenny Vaughn Hall** (Taproot Theatre's *Best of Enemies*) as Jane and **Chip Wood** (Sound Theatre Company's *Parade*) as Daniel.

The production team includes **Amanda Sweger**, scenic design; **Sarah Burch Gordon**, costume design; **Brian Engel**, lighting design; **Mark Lund**, sound design; **Sonja Lowe**, dramaturg; and **Spencer Bartelsen**, stage manager.

Following *Evidence of Things Unseen* on the Jewell Mainstage is *Busman's Honeymoon*, playing May 17 – June 17.
